

Cookie Policy

1. The service does not automatically collect any information, except for information contained in cookie files.
2. Cookies are computer data, in particular text files, which are stored on the Service User's end device and are intended for use with the Service's websites. Cookies typically contain the name of the website they come from, their storage time on the end device, and a unique number.
3. The entity placing cookies on the Service User's end device and gaining access to them is the operator of the Service *rotarywarsaw.org*.
4. Cookies are used to:
 - a. tailor the content of the Service's websites to the User's preferences and optimize the use of websites; in particular, these files allow the User's device to be recognized and the web page to be displayed tailored to their individual needs;
 - b. create statistics that help understand how Service Users use the web pages, allowing for improvement in their structure and content;
 - c. maintain the Service User's session (after logging in), so the User doesn't need to re-enter the login and password on every subpage of the Service.
5. The Service uses two basic types of cookies: "session" (session cookies) and "permanent" (persistent cookies). Session cookies are temporary files stored on the User's end device until logging out, leaving the website, or disabling the software (web browser). "Permanent" cookies are stored on the User's end device for the time specified in the cookies' parameters or until they are deleted by the User.
6. The Service uses the following types of cookies:
 - a. "essential" cookies, enabling the use of services available within the Service, e.g., authenticating cookies used for services requiring authentication within the Service;
 - b. security cookies, used to detect authentication abuses within the Service;
 - c. "performance" cookies, enabling the collection of information on how the Service's websites are used;
 - d. "functional" cookies, allowing "remembering" the settings selected by the User and personalizing the User's interface, e.g., regarding the chosen language or the region the User comes from, font size, website appearance, etc.;
 - e. "advertising" cookies, allowing users to receive advertising content more tailored to their interests.
7. In many cases, software used to browse websites (web browser) by default allows the storage of cookies on the User's end device. Service Users can change cookie settings at any time. These settings can be changed, in particular, to block the automatic handling of cookies in web browser settings or to notify of their every placement on the Service User's device. Detailed information on the possibilities and ways of handling cookies is available in the software settings (web browser).

8. The Service Operator informs that restrictions on the use of cookies may affect some functionalities available on the Service's websites.
9. Cookies placed on the Service User's end device may also be used by advertisers and partners cooperating with the Service operator.
